Now they are flawlessly integrated into the image editor and are launched in the AliveColors interface without calling a separate window. Also, the new version includes a number of other improvements in filters and tools, as well as bugs fixes and increased stability.

It is available in English, German, French, Spanish, Italian, Russian, Japanese, and Chinese (Simplified).

AliveColors comes in Free, Home (\$49), and Pro (\$160) versions, with differing levels of functionality. Users have a choice between perpetual licenses and subscription options. The update is free for lifetime licenses bought or upgraded in the last 12 months and for active subscriptions.
